The IDHS (GB) is hereby irrevocably authorised to hold the inspection in public and to publish or make available for public inspection and in such a manner as it may deem fit, whether in IDHS (GB) publications, Irish Draught Horse Studbook/Horse Sport Ireland publications, websites or otherwise the classification, inspection results and the results of the veterinary examination of the above-named stallion and any other information furnished above or pursuant to this application, without being under any obligation to do so. This applies irrespective of the stallion's classification.
7. I have read the Guidance Notes (available online at [www.idhsgb.org.uk](http://www.idhsgb.org.uk)) and the "Conditions of Irish Draught Horse Stallion Inspections", "Appeals Procedures", "Classification of Irish Draught Horse Stallions Following Inspections" and "Conditions of Stallion Classifications" (all are below) and the general rules of the IDHS (GB) and IHR incorporating the Irish Draught Horse Studbook. I agree to accept and abide by the rules and any amendments that may be made by the IDHS (GB) or HSI thereto from time to time.

## CONDITIONS OF IDHS (GB) IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE STALLION INSPECTIONS

- Applications for inspection should be returned before the relevant closing dates (15 February 2025) and must contain the following:
  - Completed and signed 'Application for Irish Draught Horse Studbook Stallion Inspections 2025' and accompanying documentation as necessary. Please note that an expression of interest form or email is not an application.
  - For animals where there is no evidence of DNA parentage testing, please submit a certificate confirming that the stallion has had his DNA profile recorded at Weatherbys DNA Laboratory.
  - 'IDHS (GB) / HSI Pre-Inspection Veterinary Screening Examination of Stallions' completed in full and signed and stamped by a qualified veterinary surgeon who treats equines as part of their normal practice;
  - A set of x-rays completed to the specification defined in the Pre-Selection Veterinary Screening form and taken by a veterinary surgeon who is either on the Horse Sport Ireland Stallion X-Ray Panel, or (in Great Britain only) a veterinary surgeon regularly treating equines in his or her normal work. These are to be emailed in JPEG format or sent via a secure web link to the Inspection Management Team at [inspections@idhsqb.org.uk](mailto:inspections@idhsqb.org.uk) on or before the closing date. Please do not send disks or zip files.
  - The appropriate application fee of **£600 inc. VAT (£450 for re inspections)**. **Please pay online** through the website at [www.idhsqb.org.uk](http://www.idhsqb.org.uk).
  - At the owner's discretion, the application form, pre inspection veterinary report and x-rays **may** be submitted in advance of the closing date **with a deposit of £150 inc. VAT** to cover the cost of the veterinary panel reading the x-rays.
  - This enables the owner to have the x-rays read before committing to send the stallion away to be produced for the inspection. Please allow at least four weeks for the x-rays to be read by all three Panel members.
  - The balance of £450 inc VAT must be paid no later than 15 February**, or the application will not be deemed to be complete.
  - The £150 x-ray element of the fee will not be refunded if the animal fails the x-ray examination or is withdrawn from inspection before the day, regardless of the reason for withdrawal.
  - Not later than four weeks before the inspection date, we will need:
    - A certificate confirming that the stallion has been tested for Equine Viral Arteritis (EVA);
    - A certificate confirming that the stallion has been tested for Equine Infectious Anaemia (EIA);
    - A certificate confirming that the stallion has been tested (this must be done after 1 January 2025) for Contagious Equine Metritis (CEM);
    - A certificate confirming that the stallion has been tested for Warmblood Fragile Foal Syndrome and is not a carrier;
    - A photocopy of the vaccinations page of the passport showing that the animal has been vaccinated to current FEI specifications.

- Class 1 inspection:** Irish Draught Horse stallions must be registered in the Main Section of the Irish Draught Horse Studbook in Ireland, Canada, the United States of America (the harmonised studbooks) or in the IDHS (GB) Breed Register.

- He must be sired by a stallion that is classified as Class 1, RID GB, Class 2 or, for 2025 and 2026 ONLY, a Class 4/UI stallion.

- He must be out of a dam that is classified as Class 1, RID, Class 2, Supplementary Grade-Up or AID in the Irish Draught Horse Studbook or any of the harmonised studbooks, or for 2025 and 2026 ONLY, a Class 4/UI mare.
  - For information about the Inspection Amnesty, please see section (5.1.4) of the Irish Draught Studbook Rules. 3. The progeny of Class 3 (veterinary failure) animals are not eligible for inspection, regardless of any Inspection Amnesty in place.
  4. **You are strongly recommended** to ask the Inspection Management Team to check your stallion's eligibility for inspection before you spend any money on veterinary examinations. We are always happy to advise and answer any questions.
  5. **All colts and stallions must be named.** This will involve sending the passport to Ireland if it was issued there. If you have to do this, please photocopy the entire document before you post it because updates may take some time to complete.
  6. **Stallions must also be correctly transferred to the correct ownership** before the application is submitted. Our IDHS (GB) Administration Office can carry out this update if the horse is normally resident in Great Britain. Owners of Irish-bred horses have the option of sending their horse's passport to Ireland for ownership transfers, or asking for this service from our own office in Cumbria. Application forms for transfer and over stamping are available on our website at [www.idhs.gb.org.uk](http://www.idhs.gb.org.uk)
  7. **Stallions must be accompanied on inspection day by an up-to-date passport.** If owners arrive with no passport, the Inspection Management Team reserves the right to refuse to allow the animal to come forward that day. This decision will be based on a risk assessment and if the inspection goes ahead, the provisional grade will not be announced, confirmed or published until the passport has been submitted. If the animal cannot be identified by his microchip, he will not be inspected and the inspection fee will be forfeited.
  8. Owners of stallions imported from Ireland on foal papers must obtain an adult passport from the IDHS (GB) if the horse is resident in Great Britain. Application forms are available on our website at [www.idhs.gb.org.uk](http://www.idhs.gb.org.uk)
  9. Stallion passports which are issued by a studbook authority other than the IDHS (GB) or Horse Sport Ireland must contain up-to-date markings and written descriptions corresponding to the stallion presented. All passports issued by other PIOs must be over-stamped (endorsed) by the IDHS (GB) prior to application. Application forms are available on our website at [www.idhs.gb.org.uk](http://www.idhs.gb.org.uk)
  10. Stallions must be adequately trained and fit to take part in all aspects of the inspection including the lungeing phase of the vetting and the loose jumping phase of the inspection. Full details of the inspection are outlined in the Guidance Notes, available online.
  11. Stallions must be trained to be cooperative and willing to be handled at the inspection, including by veterinary surgeons appointed by the IDHS (GB). The IDHS (GB) reserves the right to terminate any inspection for health and/or safety reasons.
  12. Our event risk assessment states that stallion handlers must be physically fit and strong enough to handle the stallion safely in public. This is for the protection of the handler, the inspection officials and all the horses and people present at the inspection centre. If a handler arrives with an obvious medical condition which affects their ability to control the stallion, they will be asked to nominate another person to handle the horse.
  13. Stallion owners and handlers must have all the necessary equipment (i.e. tack, leg protection boots for lungeing, lunge whips, lunge lines, etc.) at the inspection. For any ridden elements of these inspections, riders must wear 'appropriate competition riding attire'. This includes protective headgear which complies with current British Showjumping or British Eventing standards. This is compulsory for riders, whether jumping under saddle or warming up. Protective headgear to the above standards is strongly recommended for those handling stallions on the ground.
  14. All stallions will be measured at the inspection. These measurements shall be regarded as official measurements for the purpose of stallion classification. The measurements will be published after the inspection, along with the results.
  15. Where the veterinary examination of a stallion is not completed to the satisfaction of the veterinary surgeons, the horse will be classified in the Irish Horse Register/IDHS GB database as Class 3 (a stallion which has not passed the veterinary examination).
  16. Stallions which have been classified Class 2 (i.e. they did not meet all of the inspection requirements) under a previous inspection may be downgraded if the selection and veterinary examination procedures are not completed under the current application.
  17. All stallions will be photographed at the inspection. Photographs may be used in IDHS (GB)/Irish Draught Horse/Horse Sport Ireland and any other harmonised studbook publications and websites. Stallions that are not photographed at the inspection may be deemed not to have completed the selection process. The IDHS GB reserves the right not to classify these stallions.
  18. The inspectors usually publicly announce the provisional results of the stallion inspection (Class 1 or Class 2) on the day of inspection. If the horse could not complete his inspection tasks, for example on welfare grounds or lack of cooperation, he will remain in Class 4.

19. The results are sent to Horse Sport Ireland. Confirmed results will subsequently be published in IDHS (GB) and potentially in HSI Irish Draught Horse/Horse Sport Ireland publications. Bar charts and reports for stallions will be sent to owners within four weeks of the inspection date.
20. Substances that are listed on the FEI 'Equine Prohibited Substances List' (see [www.feicleansport.org](http://www.feicleansport.org)) are prohibited during the stallion inspection process. Blood samples may be taken on the day of inspection and may be subject to screening for substances listed on the FEI 'Equine Prohibited Substances List' (see [www.feicleansport.org](http://www.feicleansport.org)). Blood and/or urine samples may also be stored and used for the purpose of research.
21. The IDHS (GB) reserves the right to terminate any inspection for health and/or safety reasons. Health and safety encompasses the behaviour of the stallion and its owner/handler on the day. Any person engaging in abusive or discriminatory behaviour towards officials and/or other participants will be asked to leave the inspection centre without delay.

**Failure to satisfy the above conditions will result in a stallion being disqualified from inspection/classification.**

## **SECOND INSPECTIONS/APPEALS/VETERINARY APPEALS**

Owners will be given the opportunity to re-present the stallion on one occasion for a second inspection at the next scheduled inspection date. The appropriate application form must be completed and returned, with the usual re-inspection application fee (£450 in 2025), to the IDHS (GB). Endoscope examination and vetting must be repeated, but x-rays are carried forward from the first inspection.

Owners that do not wish to re-present the stallion for a second inspection and owners who are not satisfied with the results of the second inspection can make a formal appeal to the IDHS (GB) under the Studbook Rules. Appeals will be held at the next available inspection date, with an alternate inspection panel and will incur a fee to cover the full costs of staging an appeal.

The current Appeal fee is £1500 inc. VAT.

If owners choose to appeal the result of the first inspection, they are subsequently not allowed to apply for a second scheduled inspection.

The result of the Stallion Inspection Appeal shall be final.

### **Appeal of Veterinary Examination Result:**

For animals which fail the clinical veterinary examination on the day of the inspection, there is provision for an appeal to be made. The conditions of the appeal procedure are as follows:

- The IDHS (GB) will notify, in writing, the owner of the stallion of the reason why the stallion failed the clinical veterinary examination within two weeks of the inspection.
- The owner of the stallion may, within 28 days of the notification, apply to the IDHS (GB) to have a clinical veterinary re-examination carried out by a clinical veterinary equine specialist in the relevant field.
- The equine specialist to be consulted must be agreed with the IDHS (GB).
- The second examination should normally be carried out within 28 days of the original examination results being communicated to the owner.
- The re-examination will only be carried out in respect of the condition for which the stallion was failed on the inspection day.
- The IDHS GB must be notified in advance of the date of the additional veterinary examination.
- The full cost of the re-examination must be borne by the owner of the stallion.
- The decision of the Appeals Panel shall be final.

### **Appeal of X-Rays Examination Result:**

Owners of stallions that do not meet the radiograph requirements, following the examination of radiographs by the IDHS (GB) radiography veterinary panel, may appeal the findings of the examination. The conditions of the appeal are as follows:

- The owner of the stallion must apply to the Inspection Management Team at [inspections@idhsqb.org.uk](mailto:inspections@idhsqb.org.uk) to appeal the findings of the radiographic examination, within 28 days of the date of the inspection outcome letter;
- The appeal will involve the examination of the original radiographs by the Appeals Panel in the School of Agriculture, Food Science and Veterinary Medicine, University College Dublin Veterinary Hospital. If deemed necessary by the Appeals Panel, a new set of radiographs may be taken at a veterinary practice agreed with Horse Sport Ireland and the IDHS (GB) Veterinary Advisor;
- The full costs of the re-examination must be borne by the owner of the stallion;
- The decision of the Appeals Panel shall be final.

## Standing the stallion at stud

1. The IDHS (GB) is authorised to procure a DNA profile for the horse for identification and administration purposes within the Breed Register and the Irish Horse Register (IHR).
2. The Society Administration Office will supply covering certificates to stallion owners and other custodians only (not mare owners) on payment of £4 per certificate. Certificates ordered online at [www.idhsgb.org.uk](http://www.idhsgb.org.uk). Please contact [passports@idhsgb.org.uk](mailto:passports@idhsgb.org.uk) for further information.
3. Stallion owners/custodians are obliged to:
  - Maintain up-to-date and complete covering records;
  - Submit the certificates provided for all mares covered by the stallion by 1st October in the year of covering;
  - Submit copies of the certificates to the IDHS (GB) on demand.
4. The stallion owner must permit the IDHS (GB) to take blood samples on request. Horse Sport Ireland may change the rules from time to time with regard to the testing of various conditions and diseases.
5. Stallion owners/custodians must notify the IDHS (GB) of the death of the stallion by returning the passport to the Passport Administration Office for invalidation, as required by legislation. The passport can be returned to the owner on request.
6. Stallion owners/custodians should inform the IDHS (GB) if the health or general condition of the stallion deteriorates to the extent that the stallion is unfit or unsuitable for breeding.
7. Failure to satisfy the above conditions may result in a stallion's classification in the IDHS (GB) Breed Register/Irish Draught Horse Studbook being revoked.

## CLASSIFICATION IN THE IDHS (GB) AND IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE STUDBOOK FOLLOWING INSPECTION

### CLASS 1

This class is for inspected horses that meet the pedigree, veterinary and breed standard requirements of the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) Breed Register and hence, the Irish Draught Horse Main Studbook.

### CLASS 2

This class is for inspected horses that meet the pedigree and veterinary requirements of the IDHS (GB) Breed Register/Irish Draught Horse Main Studbook, but which have not met the inspection criteria for Class 1.

### CLASS 3

This class is for horses that fail their inspection day or pre-inspection veterinary examinations and are not recommended for breeding.

### CLASS 4/ UNINSPECTED

For all foals at registration and other uninspected purebred stock of any age. Their classification changes to Class 1, 2 or 3 following vetting and inspection. Animals which fail to complete the inspection process on the day will remain in Class 4/Uninspected.

Class 4/Uninspected animals over the age of three years may not be shown in hand at IDHS (GB) affiliated shows. In Great Britain, the progeny of Class 3 and Class 4 animals may not be shown in hand at our affiliated shows.

## HOW TO APPLY:

### By 15 February 2025, owners must submit:

- This application form and any performance data for your stallion
- The full inspection fee (please see table below)
- The pre-inspection veterinary report form, signed and stamped on every page by your vet
- X-rays (taken from 1 January 2025 for animals which will be 3 years old in that year) as specified in the pre-inspection veterinary report, submitted by your vet, in JPEG format.
- Horses coming forward for re-inspection that have submitted acceptable radiographs to the Society (or in Ireland) in a previous year do not need to be x-rayed again, but they will need a new pre-inspection veterinary examination.
- Clean health certificates for CEM, EIA and EVA.
- Confirmation that your horse has been tested for, and is not a carrier of, the condition Warmblood Fragile Foal Syndrome (WFFS)

Please make sure that your stallion's vaccinations are up to date and recorded in his passport, which you must bring with you on the day.  
If a veterinary condition is identified during our panel's examination of the x-rays which prevents your horse from coming forward, £450 of your inspection fee (i.e. the fee minus £150 for reading the x-rays) will be refunded to you.

Due to the significant professional and administrative tasks associated with the inspections, stallion applications received after the closing date cannot be accepted. Please do not send in incomplete applications on or after the closing date, because this causes delay.

Stallion Inspection Appeal (usually after a re-inspection has taken place)	£1500	Please see the Appeals procedure for details. It is cheaper to bring the stallion forward at the next inspection date for a re-inspection.

**Please make sure that before you submit your application for inspection**, the stallion has been named on his passport (you must send the passport to Ireland for this, if it is a Horse Sport Ireland document), that the passport is in your ownership (this change can be done by our passport office in Cumbria).

If the passport was issued by another passport-issuing organisation, it must be overstamped by the IDHS (GB).
